Teacher Reports:

Kindergarten

In Kindergarten we are beginning our alphabet exploration including the letters A, M, S, F, P. We are exploring the uppercase and lowercase letters, the sounds each letter

makes and how to print properly. We continue to focus on fine motor skills by tracing a variety of lines and shapes.

In Math we have learned about what a pattern is and have practiced creating different patterns using a variety of manipulatives. We are learning songs about numbers to 5 counting both forwards and backwards. We are also learning about 2D shapes and where we see these shapes in our environment.

Grade 1

In grade 1, we are starting to settle into our classroom routines. We are working hard learning to blend letter sounds into words (reading) and segment words into letter sounds (spelling).

We have been talking about seasons in science and will be completing fall tree art later this week.

In math, we continue to explore numbers within 10 and play different math and card games to further our learning.

Grade 2

In Literacy we are:

-writing friendly letters and starting UFLI a program to systematically teach letter sound combinations for reading

In math we are:

- -collecting data, representing data into graphs and answering questions about the data In science we are:
- -doing centers to identify, describe and sort the properties of various materials and then using what we learn to create an object for an intended purpose
- -exploring nature using our senses

In social we are:

-using the lens of an explorer to learn about various communities in Canada and make connections. We recently went on a community walk identifying the landforms present in Ranchlands.

Grade 3:

In Literacy students are learning to make connections when they read to help them understand the text better. In Math we're finishing up our Patterns unit and will be moving onto our Numbers unit – learning to break and reconstruct numbers in various ways i.e., place value, expanded form or using pictures to name a few. In Science, we are learning about the water cycle as well as reversible and irreversible changes.

Finally in Social, students are learning about their 'rights' and 'responsibilities' as a child/student.

Grade 4

Over the past two weeks, students have been making connections to characters and events in *The Wild Robot*, practicing evidence-based reading with *Currents4Kids*, and exploring patterns in writing through books like *Scaredy Squirrel*. They've been honing their typing skills on TypingClub and using math journals to deepen their understanding of place value, estimation, and regrouping. In Science and Social Studies, students have explored Earth's spheres, examined biofacts, and learned about Alberta's history with residential schools. In Phys Ed, they've been developing teamwork and skills through games like Pundat Ball and Ultimate Rhino Ball.

Grade 5

Grade Five students will be exploring Canada's beautiful natural regions using an Amazing race format to guide their research. We will be furthuring number understandings using patterns found in nature. We will also be experimenting with density to learn more about how to conduct a fair experiment.

Grade 6
