

Enhanced Supports









The classroom teacher is at the centre of your child's learning team and is supported by a school learning team. Based on classroom needs, each kindergarten program will also be supported by a multidisciplinary team that works with large and small groups in the classroom.

This team may consist of:

Education Assistants or Early Childhood Practitioners
Early Learning Strategists
Speech-Language Pathologists (SLPs)
Psychologists
Occupational Therapists (OTs)
Physiotherapists (PTs)
School Family Liaison (SFL)

Getting Ready for Kindergarten









Build your child's independence by encouraging them to:

- dress themselves (zippers, buttons, shoes) in all seasons
- use the bathroom and wash their hands on their own
- put away toys and help out in other small ways at home
- practice opening and closing tupperware containers, packaged snacks, peeling fruit and using a water bottle
- play games, take turns, share and compromise
- develop a consistent bedtime routine and time, ideally aiming for 9-11 hours

Getting Ready for Kindergarten









Read to your child every day:

- •read stories together in *your first language* to help your child develop vocabulary, listening and speaking skills
- •enjoy reading different types of books: picture books, information books, nursery rhymes, poetry, comics
- •encourage your child to talk about the pictures and stories as you read together
- visit your community library (when possible)

Getting Ready for Kindergarten





Take time to talk with your child about everyday activities:






- share special activities together, such as walks to the park
- talk about what you are seeing and doing
- talk, read, sing and play in *your first language* every day
- praise children for their efforts and courage to overcome setbacks



talk about how it is okay to make mistakes (growth mindset)



Recommended screen time

Pediatricians from all over Canada agree, here's how much screen time is safe for young children:

Age	Screen time recommendation
Birth to Age 2	Infants and very young children should not use screens at all, with the exception of video-calling family and friends.
Age 2-5	Limit of one hour per day total, and with an important adult whenever possible
Age 5+	Limit to a maximum of 2 hours a day in total, with an important adult whenever possible, and eliminate sedentary (non-moving) time whenever possible.

Important Times & Dates









- Office opens August 26, 2024 at 9:00 am
- Modified Schedule August 29 & August 30
 - Please see modified schedule sent to you in June for your child's times. If you have not heard about when your child is coming for staggered entry please contact the office at 403-777-6350.
 - Bussing is not available on August 29 or 30
 - August 29, 2024 45 minutes of class time. Your child will meet their teacher, explore the classroom, learn where their coat hooks are and more.
 - August 30, 2024 60 minutes of class time. Your child will tour the school, enjoy centre time, have snack and participate in circle time activities.
 - Sept. 3, 2024- your child will come at their regular time (AM or PM) and will experience a regular day of learning activities.
- Regular school hours start Sept.3, 2024. This will be your child's first half day of kindergarten. Please provide snack and indoor shoes. Bussing will be provided as per usual.

Transportation | Bussing









Bussing is provided ONE WAY for kindergarten students.


- AM class may take the bus TO school and will need to be picked up at 12:15 at door #2. Students who ride the bus will be met in the morning by our bus monitor and will be walked to door #2.
- PM class will need to be dropped off at door #2 at 12:40 and may take the bus HOME. Students who ride the bus at the end of the day will be walked to the bus by an adult.

Transportation pre-registration for the 2024-2025 school year is now open! We encourage any family who is eligible for yellow bus transportation and who thinks they may use the service to pre-register through their MyCBE/PowerSchool **Parent account** by Sunday, **June 16, 2024**. Should you wish to cancel your transportation registration it is very easy to do so at ANY time; however, should you apply after the **June 16th** deadline it will take anywhere from 4 to 6 weeks to have your child added to a bus route.

Important Locations

 Door #2-This is where your child will enter and exit the building. It is located at the front of the school near the crosswalk. If you are picking up your child, please wait at these

doors.





First Days of Kindergarten









Your child needs:

- Backpack large enough to hold a water bottle, snack, extra clothes and more
- Indoor shoes to leave at school-please ensure they can be used in gym and they can put them on and off independently (Velcro or slip on)
- Water bottle
- Extra clothes
- Daily snack-please ensure it is healthy

Transportation-sign up by Sunday, June 16th **Monday to Thursday program only**. There is no school on Fridays **Modified schedule**:


